KOATE HT (Cont.)

Newcastle

Dr. Jones informed me that Newcastle were using nothing but Alpha material. He explained his reasoning thus, that with the increasing number of haemophiliacs with pre-AIDS and AIDS, he must give these people the safest product. He quoted the Kernoff et al paper and I challenged him on its findings, but he said that no other company has any information for him. He agreed the findings were inconclusive. He would not see me before the February meeting. Chris Bishop confirmed that he has not had any Newcastle business for several months.

On speaking to Peter Jones again, price did not come into his decision, and he agrees that there are a lot of unanswered questions about extraneous proteins and their effect, etc. He said that things could quite easily change in six months' time. Cutter's opening is still there when we have the French information. He is expecting Jack Wood in February.

Derby

Dr. D. Mitchell has not bought Koate HT since August 1985 and is using only Alpha product. However, she agreed with me, after discussing the product profiles and the Kernoff paper, that she had noticed that one of her boys was not responding to prophylactic treatment. This is possibly because the specific activity is low and recovery is poor. She agreed to try Koate HT and has placed an order. A good start in regaining the business, let us hope it works.

Cardiff

I spent a long time with Professor Bloom and discussed the the Kernoff paper and the product profiles. He agreed that there are disadvantages with the Profilate and the NANB results are by no means conclusive. He said that he could foresee that he could use the new 8Y for new haemophilia patients and for those already seroconverted and that have had NANB, he could use Koate HT instead of Profilate. He still has stock and I think he needs a little more time and another push. I will write to Professor Bloom emphasising the Koate HT features and disadvantages of other products and also the price advantage that can be arranged.

Oxford

Oxford are not using Profilate at all and Dr. Rizza is not convinced in any way that he should be using it. Oxford have the lowest seroconversion rates in England and he believes that this is because of their batch policy. This has given him confidence in the Armour and Cutter material he is currently using. He has no intention of using the Alpha material. He found the product profile interesting and we discussed Peter Kernoff's paper in depth.

KOATE HT (Cont.)

Koate HT sales are £8875 below budget or 49440 IU below budget. If we had been able to supply Manchester, we would have been over budget. The Manchester order was for 300,000 IU (£36,000)

GAMIMUNE

Visits
