Dear Ian

The above patient attended on 24 August 1984 with a considerable haematoma into his R. calf. I think the calf haematoma had been present since 10 August when he had developed a re-bleed following increased exercise while on holiday in the North.

I enclose a total of the amount of factor VIII that he has received while in the North and I suppose the simplest method of payment would be for your Centre to send our Centre the same amount in kind rather than involve our respective finance officers.

Perhaps when we next meet we might discuss this type of problem as, of course, it will arise from time to time.

I saw GRO-A again before he returned home and wrote a note to Limerick Hospital to see if he could have some ultrasound to help resolve the very hard haematoma. On routine screening he had elevated liver function tests. His gamma GT was 8IU/l. with a modest rise in AST and ALT.

I hope that you had a good summer and I am sorry I will not be able to be at the Blood Club later this month, as I was already committed to a haemostasis meeting in London.
