Aids alert as 400 get suspect blood

FOUR hundred haemophiliacs in North-West England are to be screened for Aids after fears they could have contracted the disease by being given contaminated blood imported from America.

A North-West Regional Health Authority spokesman said that the tests have been ordered as a precaution. But Dr Richard Wensley, Director of Haemophilia at Manchester Royal Infirmary believes that on statistical evi-

dence two people may have contracted the disease.

The blood was imported from America, where donors are paid, and in this case was untreated.

Haemophiliacs are given Factor Eight, a blood clotting agent, to stop them bleeding.

The health authority spokesman added that all supplies of the Factor Eight were being heat-treated to destroy any traces of the virus.

A Department of Health spokesman said last night: "If any contaminated batches are found anywhere then tests can be caried out on individuals to whom the blood has been given."
