Many thanks for your report concerning S GRO-A s progress during the past term. He has recently moved from GRO-A Road, but may not have told you his new address which I give above. GRO-A has had three separate bleeding episodes during his three weeks at home and details of the treatment given are attached. One point which interests me is that the amount of Cryoprecipitate which I administered is rather less than that given by yourselves. I have found that with the admittedly relatively minor bleeds which GRO-A has had here, a total of eight units given over two days seems to control the haemorrhage adequately. If you feel that it would be better to give larger doses however, I will bring my treatment into line with yours.
