I enclose a copy of Nicholas's bleeding episodes so far this term. He bled mainly into his elbows for which he has seen Mr. Moynihan, Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon. Starting with the Elbow, Mr. Moynihan advised him to wear a block leather splint for three months together with daily physiotherapy to preserve his normal range of movement and alternate day prophylaxis. Nicholas started this programme on 4.12.79. He was also seen by Mr. Moynihan for his left knee. Radiologically, it is a badly damaged knee with marked degenerative changes and clinically his range of movement is - 5 - 100 with very weak, almost non-existent quads. Consequently, nothing should be done apart from very early symptomatic treatment when he bleeds into it.

With regard to his hare lip operation, thisswill be carried out at Oxford early in January 1980.

Biochemically, his S.G.O.T. has been intermittently raised for the past ten months and his total proteins occasionally raised.
