Within the last few days it has come to my attention that twelve patients treated at this Centre have been given a material which has proved to be HBsAg positive by radioimmunoassay testing. The above patient received the material (Kryobulin factor VIII concentrate Nr. 09M6575) on the following date - 27th June, 1975.

Your patient fortunately has antibody to hepatitis B and hopefully this will protect him from becoming jaundice. Should he develop symptoms and signs I would be most grateful if you could arrange for two 10ml. samples of clotted blood to be send to me for antibody and antigen tests. Yours sincerely.
