Thank you for your note about this boy. I am a little confused at your statement that he has only been receiving about 200 units of F.VIII for his haemarthrosis. I enclose a copy of the treatment he has received during the last term and you will see that he is certainly averaging about 600 units of F.VIII and we are quite content with the way he has been responding. He has been having fairly intensive physiotherapy at the school as we ourselves had noted his wasted quadriceps.

In our experience prophylaxis is much more effective given on alternate days than twice weekly. If he is now under your care and you wish him to continue with prophylaxis while with us, we will need to resolve the frequency and I would be grateful if you could let me have your views on this.
