1.	It was in the GRO-B when I was diagnosed with Christmas disease. I							
	believe it was GRO-B who							
	diagnosed this. Later I was told I was a mild sufferer of Haemophilia A.							
2.	I remember in the late GRO-B I went to the GRO-B to							
	have some treatment on my teeth and was given blood products.							
3.	I would also go into the GRO-B if I had a bump							
	and would be given blood products in order to help with the internal							
bleeding. I know I received Factor VIII and Cryoprecipate blood								
	few times in the 1960's, 1970's, 1980's and 1990's.							
4.	I can remember in 1973 I became jaundiced, was feeling sick and unwell							
	for about six months. This cleared up but I didn't realise it was through							
	contaminated blood products and was a symptom of hepatitis C.							
5.	Following my brother B2 GRO-B of hepatitis C							
	through an infected blood transfusion, I was invited by GRO-B							
	GRO-B to go in for screening. I didn't know my brother had							
	contracted this infection, he didn't tell me or any other family member.							
6.	I was invited back again to the hospital for the results where I was given							
	the diagnosis of hepatitis C which I had contracted through contaminated							
	blood infused into me. There is an entry in my medical records where it							
	appears there was a "first" discussion about my diagnosis of Hepatitis C in							

April 1997. On this occasion, I learned my brother had contracted hepatitis C through contaminated blood too.

3. Other Infections

1. I have possibly contracted CJD.

4. Consent

 Prior to me finding out about the hepatitis C, I would routinely have blood tests. I assumed it was because of the haemophilia. I am surprised to learn through my medical notes that it was known for some time I had contracted hepatitis C and I was not told of this until 2003.

5. Impact

- 1. When I was told I had contracted the hepatitis C through infected blood I was shocked. They told me there was some damage to my liver and didn't give me or my brother B1 much hope. B1 was diagnosed in 1985 but not told until after B2 death in 2002 when we both went for screening.
- 2. I was offered treatment of Interferon more or less straight away. So didn't have much time to think about it. I was told about the side effects which I did suffer from some of them such as tiredness but it didn't have a massive effect on me as I was positive the infection would clear. This was the case. After a course of Interferon and Ribavirin the infection cleared.
- 3. Around about the same time I had been diagnosed with Follicular lymphoma and was more worried about this than the hepatitis C. Seeing patients deteriorate every day affected me more. I am a positive person and always look on the bright side.

	4.	I think my diagnosis had more of an effect on my wife, GRO-B I know she was very worried about me at the time. But the cancer overtook the anxiety as we felt this was worse than hepatitis C. It is still at the back of mind that it may come back. The hospital are keeping an eye on it by regular blood tests every six months.
	5.	I do worry about my brother B1 as he too was diagnosed with hepatitis C around the same time as me. B1 has been affected greatly and I am more concerned about him.
	6.	My brother B2 died from this infection and I worry I may lose B1 because of how he as been affected and the way this has disabled him. I do know what can happen.
	7.	I am very thankful for my treatment as it could have been so different. I always think that if B2 had his infected blood a year before me and that is why he died when he did. Maybe if he had it the same year as me, he would have been treated and cleared of the infection.
6.	Tre	eatment/Care/Support
		I wasn't offered any support or counselling at the time of being diagnosed. I was told not to share razors and to be careful of any cuts because of cross contamination.

- 2. In all honesty, the hospital was very supportive and looked after me very well.
- 3. I was given the Interferon and Ribavirin treatment. After this course I was very fortunate the hepatitis C cleared, although it hasn't been said to me it has been cured 100%. As far as I am aware my liver is not in a bad state and it is healing as well as can be expected.
