Thank you for sending me a copy of the letter you wrote to Dr. Whitehead in which you state that you think it would be wise for us to stick to one product and suggesting Hemofil.

Since Richard has been with us, he has received a total of 208 transfusions. The material he has received is broken down as follows:-

Kryobulin	80
Lister	73
Factorate	24
Hemofil	16
Koate	15

I think on this basis, were I to pick a product for him to remain on, it would certainly be Kryobulin or Lister. However, his ability to take over 200 transfusions of Concentrate without any reaction suggests that there is not really a problem here and in view of the difficulties we experience in supplying replacement material for 55 severe haemophiliacs, I would prefer not to confine Richard to a single Concentrate. We are aware that he is allergic to Cryoprecipitate and he has not received any of this material at the school.
