I am sorry if I may have come across at times as over zealous.

As I have said I have lost numerous friends over the years to this tragedy and have stayed in touch with many families and I have seen what the devastation is when a loved one dies from the effects of contaminated blood, some families have lost three loved ones, heaven only knows how they cope.

That is why I feel so strongly regarding this matter because I feel her comments are a slap in the face for every family that has lost a loved one over the years, and those that will die in the future.

In the church St Botolph without Bishopgate in London where there is a icon dedicated, and a book of remembrance with names and ages of those that have died, some as young as seven, the inscription reads,,,

IN MEMORY OF PEOPLE WITH HAEMOPHILIA WHO HAVE DIED AS A RESULT OF TREATMENT WITH CONTAMINATED BLOOD PRODUCTS.

Jan Barlow should go to the church and stand in front of the icon and the book of remembrance to hang her head in shame.

Liz, and the rest of the Board you have been like a breath of fresh air to those of us who have not just been battling our numerous virus's and illness over the years but also government and the very Charities set up to help us! and I hate to say at times the Haemophilia Society, and as a Haemophiliac infected with both HIV and HEP C, I thank the board for this decision, as it will mean so much, to so many people.
