3. In January 1991 Ministers agreed to the introduction of HCV testing as soon as possible on the unanimous advice of the expert Advisory Committee on the Virological Safety of Blood (ACVSB). AT that time the technology was still being developed and evaluations of the screening kits were needed. 4. The Department has recently settled the litigation by hacmophiliacs infected with HIV through blood products. There is current sensitivity surrounding blood transfusion recipients who were also infected.
