Dear Dr. Clark,

Thank you for letting me know about GRO-A. We normally give the young patients with hæmophilia treatment with Cryoprecipitate rather than Factor VIII concentrates. In the past we found several developed jaundice when they were given Factor VIII concentrates and I think the incidence of hepatitis is much lower when we use North Western Cryoprecipitate than when we use the imported concentrates. We tend to keep the concentrates for use with patients who are on home treatment, and use Cryoprecipitate in hospital.
