this lot was manufactured for an outstanding order for AB type plasma for Japan. The lot was manufactured in Clayton and originally rejected by Japan because the unitage was less than 1000 AHF units per vial. No immediate market was available for an AB lot of ultrafilter process. The lot could not be rebulked for Japan since it would exceed 3 months from date of bulk at the fill date after reworking. This lot was ER'd and referred to the CMRB. The CMRB ruled that the lot was acceptable since it did not violate any release criteria.

This lot is a rebulk of 59N004 manufactured for Japan and rejected by them because AHF assay was less than 500. The lot was rebulked November 12 into 250 for the U.K. At that time marketing had an verbal agreement from the U.K. to take this lot to fill their 1984 requirements for ultra-filter products. The lot was submitted to the U.K. in December. Marketing notified us at the end of December that ultra-filter material could no longer be shipped to the U.K. based on instructions from the British govt. Only HT products would be allowed into the market.

This lot was amnufactured in Berkeley for the Japanese market and was rejected for unitage less than 500 AHF and for vacuum. The vacuum rejection was by Japan based on test samples sent to them and registered somewhere between 2 to 4 inches by their testing. No vacuum was found in the vials by our testing. The lot has remained in work-in-process awaiting disposition since its manufacture.

The above lot was manufactured to fill an order for the Canadian market but the AHF assay was too low for their use. The lot was then submitted for the U.K. and accepted pending requirement for 250 size product. No requirement for this size was placed before the government decree to stop non heated materials.

This lot was manufactured specifically at higher than normal AHF assay to fill a requirement for Ireland. Fart of the lot was sold to them and part was designated for Canada and the U.K. Originally the U.K. was willing to accept quantities not sold to Ireland. Since the edict by the British government this is

no longer a possibility.
