

Re: RODNEY PROSSER : GRO-C 43.

Mr. Prosser was admitted to the casualty department here on the 6th March 1986. He had sustained a laceration above his right eye, which was sutured. He had a haematoma surrounding his right eye.

He told us he was "mildly haemophiliac" and had been given Factor VIII in the past. Given the head injury and possible loss of consciousness at the time of injury, he was given Factor VIII.

Observation was uneventful. He has been sent home but needs follow up because of the slight risk of hepatitis following Factor VIII. Therefore, could you arrange for him to have liver function tests once every 2 weeks.

I have advised him to go to see Dr. Omer at Boscombe to get some documentation as to the qualitative nature of his clotting defect, which is indeed very mild.

I would be grateful if you could arrange this, sending copies to Dr. Lee Potter at Poole General, and a copy to Poole so that it can be filed in his note.
