I would be very grateful if you would see this man, who has severe emphysema and who is being considered either for lung transplantation or lung reduction surgery. In fact both of these options have been felt to be inappropriate at the present time while he has sufficient lung function to get about.

During routine testing for possible lung transplantation at Papworth it was discovered that he is Hepatitis C positive, and you will see from the recent result that he is RNA positive as well, which I presume means some degree of activity. His ALT is slightly raised.

I have not told Mr Le Bourn that his tests have also shown evidence of previous Hepatitis B. I did not want to question him closely on his sexual and possible IV drug habits, although I think you may have to do this. As far as I know he has never had a blood transfusion, but again I have not asked directly.

I would be most grateful if you would see him. He is a rather introverted, anxious and questioning man, who will require quite a bit of your time. I am sure that you will be able to put his mind at rest on the Hepatitis question much better than me, and you may feel that he deserves treatment at this stage.
