

*Haemophilia*

I attach a copy of the Note of the meeting on Haemophilia Centres on 15 October. You were unable to be present. This is a draft note and has been circulated to those present for comment. All comments have not yet been received, but so far many directors are emphasising the importance of paras b) c) and d) on page 3.

At a recent meeting with representatives of the Haemophilia Society Dr Ingram suggested it would be helpful if units of cryoprecipitate could be pooled into batches of 5 as, apart from the case of children, this was the usual dose, and such presentation would ease the work of treatment centres. I undertook to raise this with R.T.C. Directors, and wonder if you would agree this matter, and possibly the more general one of supply of cryoprecipitate, could be put on the agenda for the next meeting of R T C Directors.
