Haem review

He has undoubtedly and rather surprisingly suffered a substantial bleed into the operated knee joint. He followed normal physiotherapy which, given the level of replacement therapy, I would have expected him to tolerate without abnormal bleeding. His bleeding tendency is, of course, exacerbated by his moderate thrombocytopenia. This bleed seems to be responding to the increased intensity of replacement but a bleed of this magnitude will take days/weeks to resolve completely.

There was no hint of any inhibitor in the early operative period and to develop an inhibitor at this stage in an intensively treated man of this age would be extremely unusual. Nevertheless we will check his factor VIII level pre and post tomorrow's dose. In the meantime he should continue to take 3 bottles b.i.d.
