I would be grateful if this man could be seen in surgery very urgently. He is a haemophiliac and although HIV negative has chronic hepatitis C, which has led to cirrhosis. Over the last few months he has had intermittent bleeding from the tongue. This tends to occur perhaps every other day and lasts for 5 to 10 minutes. Unfortunately he has not been particularly compliant in taking tranexamic acid and instead has been injecting himself with several thousand units of Factor VIII in attempt to stop the bleeding. On examination he does have a fairly deep mid line crease to his tongue and a small crevice which appears to be the site of his intermittent bleeding. He has commenced regular mouth wash and we have encouraged him to take his tranexamic acid regularly. Dr Hay would be grateful if he could be seen in your clinic so that his oral cavity could be assessed and we would welcome any advice that you may have to suggest.
