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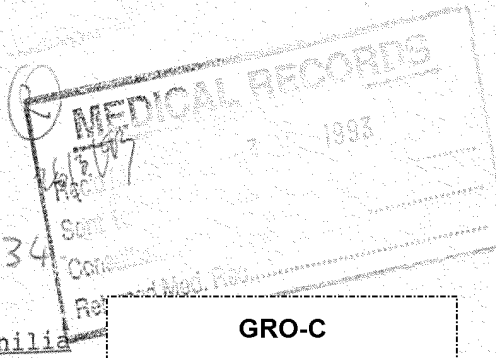

Diagnosis - Severe Haemophilia



I would be grateful for your advice about this gentleman's varicose ulceration. He is HIV zero-negative, but has cirrhosis of the liver secondary to chronic hepatitis C. He has bilateral varicose veins and appears to have varicose eczema affecting both legs, particularly the right. He has an area of varicose eczema surrounding a small ulcer over his right malleolus. So far he has only been putting dry dressings on and elevating the leg, but over a period of several months it has failed to heal and is limiting his mobility to an undesirable degree, and I do not know what else to offer him.
