SCOTTISH HAEMOPHILIA/HIV LITIGATION GROUP

I am the Chairman of the Scottish Haemophilia/HIV Litigation Group, which is an Association of Scottish Firms of Scilictors who represent the interests of Haemophiliacs who have contracted the HIV virus or Aids through contaminated blood products. You will be aware that proceedings have been raised in the Court of Session in Edinburgh in a number of cases and a number of other cases are in the course of preparation for litigation.

and members of my Group, were dismayed to learn from press and dia reports last evening of the agreement by the Government to nav a further £42,000,000 to Haemorbiliacs who have contracted HIV or Aids. Although any additional payments to Haemorbiliacs are to be welcomed, I am alarmed by the report that the additional payments arise from Her Majesty's Government accepting an offer from 'the lawyers representing the HIV/Haemorbiliac plaintiffs who are suing the Government for negligence'. Not only were the Scottish lawyers excluded from the discussions with the Government, they were not even advised that these discussions were taking place. You will appreciate that there are clear and identifiable differences between the litigation in Scotland and the litigation in England, not least that you are responsible for the Health Service in Scotland, whereas the Secretary of State for Health is responsible in England.
