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> Dear All,

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> In August armed with a revised London MREC approval I approached
> Centres in the hope that they would confirm if they had submitted all
> their data or arrange it's submission. We have received more
> information, which I will try to get into a summary for a meeting of
> the UKCHDO Transfusion Transmitted Infection Working Party, which I
> hope to hold in the first 2 weeks of December.

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> I am about to go on leave until my retirement on 12 November and
> will then have a fallow month, before returning to work for 3 months
> from 13 December without clinical or on-call responsibilities, to tie
> up all the loose ends.

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> I am therefore anxious now we have an improved data set, to meet
> with you and have a plan for data analysis and the reporting of this.

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> I would be grateful if you could indicate to my secretary if you are
