Dear Dr Rizza

I am setting out below our plan for the joint study which we discussed at Oxford and by telephone last week.

The aims of the study are:-

- 1. To establish the degree of immunological abnormality in a population of heavily treated haemophiliacs treated exclusively with ${\hbox{\scriptsize NHS}}$ concentrate.
- 2. To confirm the differences in T subset distribution we have found between patients with haemophilia A and haemophilia B.

Details of the patients which are required:-

- Age
- 2. Disorder
- 3. Treatment
- 4. Weight (so that treatment can be expressed as u/kg)
