As you may have heard there is an increased risk of the acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS) in patients with haemophilia who have a regular clotting factor concentrate presumably because of the transfusion from blood donors with the virus which is now believed to be the cause of AIDS. Accordingly we are seeing all our patients who regularly receive clotting factor concentrates and giving them advice on careful handling of home treatment and on sexual intercourse as detailed in the enclosed letter. All our patients are now being tested for the virus HTLV - III and you will be kept informed of this. I saw your patient recently and he has been issued with a copy of the enclosed guidelines. Please let me know if you have any queries.
