GRO-B was admitted over a weekend, following a knee bleed into his bad knee which had started 2 days previously and was not settling with home treatment.

On examination he had swelling of the knee with boggiess in the suprapatellar pouch and moderate effusion. He also lost the last few degrees of extension. This was not as bad as his previous knee bleed. He was admitted for bed rest and given 1,000 units of Factor VIII daily along with active physio.

On this regime the swelling went down and his knee improved. He was allowed home after four days.

He was seen subsequently in the Haemophilia Centre and although his knee is much better and his quadriceps much stronger there is still some residual synovial thickening.

I suggested that he take 2 bottles of Factor VIII every third day and continues with his physiotherapy. He will be seen again in mid December.

He was observed to give himself 30-1s. of Factor 3 solution with admirable efficiency, and discharged home to rest.
