1 iu/dl) at the Haemophilia Clinic on 23.6.92. He recently sat 2 Highers and awaits the results and he has now finished at school and is applying for office or laboratory jobs. I note he has a mobility allowance and continues on home treatment with Factor VIII concentrate with which he has had no problems. He continues to bleed approximately fortnightly, usually into his hands while walking the dog. His ankles are in good shape. He saw the dentist 2 months ago and does not require any treatment at present and he has a bleeding disorder's card. Physical examination was unremarkable apart from some crepitus in the left knee. I explained to him that later this year we shall be replacing the current intermediate purity Scottish factor VIII concentrate with a new high potency concentrate and we will send him information on this and consent to inclusion in the clinical assessment trial. We checked his usual bloods and will write with the results. We are still looking into the possibility of obtaining some Interferon for treatment of chronic hepatitis. He will continue to be reviewed 6 monthly at the clinic.
