Further to Dr Malekianpour's letter of 20 March I now have results on this boy with severe haemophilia A. Factor VIII level was less than 1% of normal and screening for factor VIII inhibitor was negative. Full blood count was normal as was blood urea and electrolytes. Liver function tests showed an elevated ALT level at 73 u/l but were otherwise normal as were his immunoglabulins. I note that when he attended Yorkhill Hospital he had elevations of his ALT which may represent a degree of chronic non A non B hepatitis. We are arranging a dental check up and in view of his home treatment with factor VIII we will review him 6 monthly. I have also filled in an attendance allowance form. Incidentally he is immune to hepatitis B with very high levels of antibodies to hepatitis B surface antigen.
