Thank you for your letter of 15th June 1989 about this man's liver function tests. I enclose copies of his biochemical profiles over the last four years. As you can see, his liver enzymes have been consistently, but very minimally raised.

The significance of these results is uncertain and in patients with bleeding disorders, it is not our policy to perform liver biopsies unless absolutely indicated. It probably indicates mild chronic non-A non-B hepatitis acquired from factor VIII treatment before heat-treatment of concentrate was undertaken.

Dear Mr Redman,

I have enclosed some information from the hepatitis meeting held in the Haemophilia Centre on 24th March, which you may be interested to read.

I have been looking through the results on some of our patients and I see that your recent blood tests have been abnormal indicating some inflammation in the liver.

I wonder if you would be interested in participating in a trial of the drug Ribavirin as treatment for this form of hepatitis. The trial would involve taking the drug, or a dummy preparation for six months, followed by six months of follow up.

If you would be interested, perhaps you could phone to make an appointment to see me at the Haemophilia Centre.
