

APPENDIX 2

The Plaintiff felt helpless and trapped by his HIV status. He became deeply resentful that he was faced with a situation which he believed could have been avoided. He felt this especially in view of his previous experience with hepatitis infection.

The past four years have been a nightmare. He has continual worry associated with his condition, he suffers intermittent symptoms of nausea, appetite liss and the experience of feeling knotted-up in his stomach. These symptoms have been particularly prevalent over the past two years since the Plaintiff learned that his T4 counts have plummeted. The has suffered with a chronic skin condition around his ankles which may be related to the AIDS virus.

His HIV status has interfered with the sexual side of his relationship with his wife. He has now permanently shelved plans for children and regrets now not having children prior to his infection.

The Plaintiff suffered depersonalisation, subjective giddiness and generalised nervousness. It is alleged that these symptoms constituted a psychiatric condition although of moderate severity. The prognosis is that there is a greater than 50% chance that the Plaintiff will again develop psychiatric symptoms if his physical condition deteriorates.

The Plaintiff has had difficulty in financing the purchase of his own house and in addition the Plaintiff is unlikely to be able to progress further in his career, due to his wish to avoid interviews where his health may be discussed. It is doubted whether he will be realistically able to move house again, although ideally he would like something slightly bigger in a few years time.

APPENDIX 3

The Plaintiff suffered a severe episode of hepatitis in 1975 and in 1982 he suffered the onset of psoriasis which continues to trouble him.
