Re: Annual Returns from Haemophilia Centres

Thank you for the completed Annual Returns forms for 1977 received last week.

The Annual Returns from Haemophilia Centres were discussed at a recent meeting of the Haemophilia Reference Centre Directors and it was decided that much useful information would be obtained on a National scale if data was collected and analysed in Oxford regarding the amount of materials supplied to patients on home treatment and also of the amount of materials used for patients who have anti-factor VIII or anti-factor IX antibodies. The Reference Centre Directors realise that it might not be possible for some Centres to provide the data for patients treated during 1977, but would be most grateful if you could arrange for the information to be collected throughout 1978 ready for inclusion in the 1978 Annual Returns. If data for 1977 is available, we would be pleased if you could arrange for completion of the enclosed forms and return them to me. A "nil" or "no data available" return for 1977 would also be appreciated.
