# Aids fear for boys at hospital

TWO brothers and a third boy attending Charing Cross Hospital are carrying an Aids virus, hospital at chief's said this week.

The boys, aged eight, nine and ton, suffer from haemophilia — a disease which stops the bload from clotting.

The boys were given an infected dose of Factor VIII a plasma needed by haemophiliacs to help their bload to clot.

The dose the boys received was imported from the United States. Britain is not self-sufficient in its production of plasma.

The boys were found to be carrying the virus during routine lests at Charing Cross Hospital.

The children do not necessarily have the killer disease Aids, but experts say that about one in ten people found with the virus later develop the disease.

Because of their low resistance to infections, haemophiliacs stand a higher than average chance of catching the disease.

The parents of the children — who are not being named by hospital staff because they want to remain anonymous — know of the risks to their children.


