I saw Brian for review today. He was not his usual cheerful self, I think largely because of increasing pain in his left knee. I am trying him with a TENs machine and have written to Mr Hirst to see if it will be possible to bring his surgery forward.

The other major subject for discussion was his hepatitis C. We have been discussing treating this for sometime but he deferred this until after his latest child was born because he did not want the Interferon to interfere with fertility. He is now very keen to start treatment. We would normally choose to treat with a combination of Interferon and Ribivarin. I have started the Interferon 3 million units 3 times a week today with warnings about the side-effects. These are usually worse for the first 2 weeks and so we will see him again in two weeks time with a view to starting the Ribivarin. I have taken baseline blood tests today.
