Dear Ian

I am having yet another sleepless night in despair due to this latest turn of events with THT and the hold THT has over my life and that of other MFT beneficiaries' lives.

For me, as someone infected and living with HIV for over three decades it is taking a toll on my health. This is not acceptable from an organisation which supports people living with HIV.

I spoke with you on 17 December and you asked me to be patient while you reviewed the paperwork. I subsequently had conversations with David Barlow who assured me all was in hand. Yet here we are in early February and you are not prepared to meet for another month (7 March) then that is only a 'general' discussion between 1pm and 2 30pm. At that meeting, you are not prepared to discuss individual cases until after trustees meet later in March and have discussed the 'process'.

I was told by the interim CEO of MFT in late December that she had been in discussions "for months" with you regarding the transfer of funds and 'loans' to THT. So I do not understand why the trustees are not up to date on this and ready to act.

Since our conversation on 17 December - over 7 weeks ago, THT has made claims on our homes, received data without our permission yet have not met with us. We are left in the dark and have no idea what THT propose to do about the 'loans' and 'charges' on our homes.

This does not bode well. It is very worrying move after what we thought was a positive start. Our initial contact with THT and assurances gave us hope. We have been patient but now I am very worried. MFT relied on our silence because of the stigma of speaking out living with HIV. I hope THT are not doing the same.

I wrote a week ago asking for a meeting as a matter of urgency after discovering THT had made claim to my home as 'Lender'. I also asked for the paperwork to substantiate that claim yet I have not received that documentation.

I will attend the meeting offered for a 'general' discussion in March. We can discuss the funds THT have to support MFT beneficiaries.

But your response to my individual case is very disappointing. I urge that you reconsider and arrange a meeting as a matter of urgency with me to discuss the claim on my home. I need to know what you view is as CEO and what you intend to do to remove this 'charge' off my home.
