The HIV aspects of my CV are separately documented below. I undertook 32 years of HIV clinical work between 1984 and 2015 [Namibia]. It's curious to reflect that the scale and range of my ultimate HIV involvement was contingent on the chance admission of the first two HIV cases in Scotland to my ward. Here, in the context of a completely new disease, the

novel experience of 2 cases immediately elevated you to be `an expert`. Everything is relative!
