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Dear Andrej

You were asking us yesterday to let you know of specific problems that we have encountered in relation to Health Authorities paying for alpha Interferon for the treatment of hepatitis C. Since the Secretary of State for health has gone on record in the House as saying that nobody suitable for Interferon therapy should be denied this.

I have to tell you that we have encountered consistent problems with two of our Health Authorities, namely Central Manchester and Trafford Health Authority. These two Health Authorities take the rather paradoxical view that they were paying for haemophilia services before and we should just absorb it within our costs despite the fact that no Interferon was prescribed in this practice before the product gained it's licence.

We have not in general been prescribing it to HIV positive patients or to middle aged or older patients but, have tended to push it for those with abnormal LFT's who are relatively young and HIV negative. We are not therefore talking in terms of very large numbers which should cause the Health Authority significant financial embarrassment.

I should add that these selfsame Health Authorities are also refusing to pay us for surgery, mobilising the same argument despite the fact that prior to me taking up post in Manchester virtually no surgery was taking place. Our cost per case contract exclude surgery and Interferon, and in each case we ask for permission to pay in advance of starting the treatment.
