- 5. My father had a lot of FVIII treatment. He self administered the treatment at home on a regular basis and was wheelchair bound through the numerous bleeds into his joints. My father could not work and was reliant upon benefits. My mother was a housewife and mother bringing up her three children: my two older brothers and me.
- 6. In the mid 1980s my father was informed that he had HIV. I was young and do not remember much about it. I do not think that I was told. It was just something we knew.
- 7. My understanding is that the contaminated FVIII concentrate given to my father had come in from the USA and there was very little the doctors could do for him. I remember that my mother turned to drink badly at that time. I do not know when it was that my father found out he had hepatitis.
- 8. My father was both 'Mum and Dad' to us. He would try to be reassuring to me, telling me that he was 'OK' even when he knew he was dying. I was the youngest and he was very protective of me.

Section 3. Other Infections

9. I do not believe my father received any other infections than HBV, HCV and HIV.

Section 4. Consent

10. I do not know if my father was treated or tested without his knowledge and consent as I was so young at the time. Blood samples were taken from him every time he went to the GRO-B Hospital. I do not know why.

Section 5. Impact of the Infection

- 11. My father's health deteriorated and he was in so much pain. He would shake uncontrollably and he started to lose a lot of weight. My father would sweat and vomit. He lost control of his bowels and would mess himself. My Auntie GRO-B who lived five minutes away, would come over and help clean him up. It was degrading for him. He was psychologically vulnerable.
- 12.I was still at school when my father became ill. It had a terrible effect on me. He was my dad and I loved him. We lived in a small town and as people found out what was wrong with my father, they said insensitive things about him to me. Our family was stigmatised.
- 13. When my father died, our family fell apart. It was a shock to us and we lost our mum not long afterwards. I was pregnant and had moved out to live with my then partner. One of my brothers was still living at home and was evicted from it. It was a three bedroom local authority house, deemed too big for a single person. All our lives were affected.
- 14. My life would have been very different had my father not been infected. I did not appreciate how much the manner of my father's death had affected me until relatively recently. Since my father's death I have had a deep seated mistrust of the medical profession. In October 2019 I became dangerously unwell and I was barely able to breathe. Despite being so unwell, I refused to see a doctor. I would not have sought medical attention had it not been for my son making me go. It transpired that I was severely anaemic with a red cell blood count of 54 when it should have been at over 130. In short I had

lost one third of my red blood cells. I needed emergency treatment by way of intravenous iron.

15.I have now spoken at length to a doctor at the hospital and she believes that I need psychological counselling because of what happened to my father. I, myself, was so ill and had left it so long without seeking the medical attention I urgently needed that she commented that she did not know how I had even managed to walk in.

Section 6. Treatment/care/support

- 16.I am unsure but I don't think that my father received any treatment for HIV and/or hepatitis.
- 17. None of the family were offered counselling and support. I have only relatively recently been referred for counselling and only after my own physical health was jeopardised.

Section 7. Financial Assistance

18. I think we received a small pay out of £20,000 many years ago.

Section 8. Other Issues

19. There are no other issues.
