Very many thanks for your most helpful letter of the 22nd March. I have asked Bob Perry (Director, PFC) to arrange to send you sufficient material to study 3 patients - invivo % recovery and $t\frac{1}{2}$ life - using our latest product (dry heated treated 68°C for 24 hours).

I enclose a new protocol sheet for this study which tries to take on board current anxieties with regard to HTLV-III A/B positive patients - we have cut down the number of samples required and intend to measure Factor VIII C only.

If you have any problems with getting assays done then Chris Prowse's team will do them.

If you are happy with this product then we might further discuss a next more. One option - before we embark upon a major study on virgin patients would be to provide you with sufficient material to cover a surgical procedure - to let you look at clinical efficacy. Beyond that we'd particularly like to let your team loose on the product which has been split and exposed to different calcium ion content.
