For your information I enclose copies of:-

- 1) His bleeding episodes and transfusions so far this term
- 2) Orthopaedic chart
- 3) Laboratory results

He was found to be iron deficient on routine blood testing and I have started him on Ferrous Sulphate 200 mg. t.d.s. on 3.7.83 for three months.

On 17.5.83 he fell over his left forearm and fractured both radius and ulna. This was reduced under factor VIII cover and his left forearm was put into a full length plaster of paris. He received daily factor VIII transfusions until 26.5.83 and his P.O.P. was removed on 21.6.83.

Because of targeting into his left elbow we have started GRO-A on alternate day 20% raise prophylaxis on 4.7.83 for a period of four weeks. If you are agreeable to continuing this programme, would it be possible to supply him with material after leaving the college on 8.7.83. As you know, his mother is capable of transfusing him and I have asked his parents to contact you.

GRO-A attends physiotherapy regularly for general exercises, particularly to his left shoulder whilst still in P.O.P. for his fractured forearm and his left wrist after removing the plaster.

## AIDS RELATED INVESTIGATIONS:

Clinically he exhibits none of the stigmata of AIDS. Examination

of his superficial lymph nodes in March 1983 and 23.6.83 revealed no palapble lymph nodes.

For your information we have undertaken the enclosed AIDS related tests. We are repeating these tests before the end of term and will let you have the results when they are available.
