DATE	CLINICAL NOTES (Each entry must be signed)
24/5/73	Pre: 17. Post: 110%. Another 10 bottles of Hyland were given in the evening. Postent is keeping very well. He is on fluids only. 10 Bottles of Hyland given PRE = 60%. POST: 140%. 5 Bottles in the evening.
25/5/73	Hb: 8 bottles of Hyland administered in the morning and 5 bottles in the evening. PRE: 64%. POST: 130%. The surgeons couldn't find an ulcer during the operation and they made an antrectomy and vagotomy, and appendicectomy. Mr Gunning's report "No gross abnormality detected in the lesser sac and no gastric ulcer seen, a felt. Pylorus and duodenum examined and found to be free of adhesions, except posteriorly in the lesser sac. No ectopic ulceration could be seen or felt. In view of the history of demargination of an ulcer radiologically and haematemesis, and the fact that the boy is a haemophilic it was decided to do a vagotomy and antrectomy in that this operation gives the best facilities to removal of an ulcer."
