I saw Colin in the clinic again this week. I understand that he turned up at the paediatric ward about a week ago having falling down and hit the back of his head. He received an intravenous injection of one bottle of 250 units of Factor VIII concentrate and made an uneventful recovery without any swidence of intracranial bleeding. The concentrate which we used was prepared from Smittah blood from the Lister Institute. However, all these materials carry the risk of hepatitis, particularly non-A, non-B, but this is something that heemothiliacs have to accept. Dr. Hewlett and I will keep a close observation on him as the souths go by:

I have now heard from Professor Hardisty at Great Ormond Street, (but the boy's opissis Phillip Wheeler was indeed under his care having been confirmed as suffering from classical hassophilia, Factor VIII level less than 19.
This is consistent with the findings and the clinical presentation of Colin.

As far us day-to-day treatment is concerned he will probably arrange to be seen during normal working hours as needed at the Boyal Gment Hospital, but it may be advisable in the case of bleeds after hours for him to some directly to the Faediatric Ward at this hospital. No doubt Dr. Howlett, the parents and I can come to some mitually acceptable arrangement concerning this:

In the meanwhile I have just made an appointment to see him spain routinely in six months! time or earlier as indicated.
