Re Hepatitis C Haemophiliacs

Dear Mr. Naring

My husband was a Haemophiliac, who was infected <sup>with</sup> Hep C from receiving contaminated Blood Products Factor VIII. He did develop severe liver disease infection which led to liver cancer this resulted in his death Sept '94

My husband was one of three Haemophiliac Brothers, all three have died as a result of receiving contaminated blood. Two Brothers sadly died from H.I.V. Two different virus from ~~the same~~ <sup>this one</sup> product, but with the same ending.

Another point in this sad case is the difference in the way the Government looks at it. The families of have received recompense for the brothers who died from H.I.V. by self and my family are not recognised and the government say they have no intention of doing so. All the families are disappointed at their approach. At the end of the day three brothers have died, we have three widows a 90yr old mother who has lost her three sons 5 children have lost their fathers & us there is no difference between all three brothers all suffered greatly.

The House of Lords held a debate 15/6/95 in which this case was highlighted. I would ask you to give the case and all other Haemophiliacs who will suffer with Hepatitis C your ~~and~~ consideration to and add your name to the list of M.P.s who signed the early day motion 8/6/95. My mother in law Mrs C Murphy has written to you about this matter. We were therefore disappointed to see that your name was not listed as having signed this motion.
