1.	My name is David James Perry. My date of birth is GRO-C 1954. My address is GRO-C
2.	My professional qualifications are MB ChB (University of Edinburgh) 1978; MRCP

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- 2. (UK) 1980; MRCPath 1985; MD (University of Edinburgh) 1992; PhD (University of Cambridge) 1993; FRCPath 1995, FRCEdin 1997; FRCPLond 2008.
- 3. I was appointed to the West Midlands rotational training scheme in Haematology in July 1983 and left in November 1987.
- 4. In April 1985 to September 1986, I was a trainee senior registrar at the Birmingham Children's Hospital. I worked under the supervision of Consultant Haematologists, Dr FGH Hill and Dr PJ Darbyshire.
- 5. My responsibilities during this period were the management of children both inpatients and out-patients with haematological disorders, under the close supervision of both consultants.
- 6. I have no membership of any committees or groups, past or present that are relevant to the Inquiry's Terms of Reference.

Section 2: Letter dated 11 October 1985

- 7. Mr Beard's statement refers to a letter from Dr V E Mitchell at Leicester Royal Infirmary to me dated 11 October 1985, specifically where he notes that Mr Beard was HTLV 3 antibody positive but was not aware of this and that I did not wish this to be divulged to him.
- 8. As I outlined in my previous statement dated 17 May 2019, I am unable to comment upon the screening for HTLV 3 antibodies. I was not responsible for instituting viral screening of patients registered with the Birmingham Children's Hospital. The letter stating that I did not wish the HTLV 3 antibody status to be divulged to Mr Beard would have been the instructions I had received from my senior consultant colleagues and not a decision I would have made independently.
- 9. I was at this time a trainee under the close supervision of Dr FGH Hill, consultant haematologist at the Birmingham Children's Hospital.

HTLV 3 testing practices at the Birmingham Children's Hospital

10. As I have outlined above, I was a trainee in Haematology during this period and I was not involved in decisions involving HTLV 3 antibody testing and I am, therefore, unable to comment upon 'HTLV 3 testing practices at the Birmingham Children's Hospital'.
