Your patient attended the joint Haemophilia/Hepatitis R Clinic on 1 September 1997. I am pleased to say that he remains PCR negative, 6 months post treatment and can now be classified as a sustained responder to Interferon therapy. For this reason, he will require a repeat HCV RNA in one year which can be carried out at the general Haemophilia Clinic. It would seem, in view of his recent normal liver function test, that he has been cured of Hepatitis C.
