As we discussed with Dr Walker, I write to transfer this moderately severe Haemophiliac (Factor VIII 10iu/dl) from human factor (Liberate) to Recombinant Factor VIII (Recombinate) this week, while he is in Glasgow. He is temporarily resident in GROB so I'm copying this letter to Dr Taylor, Haemophilia Director at Inverness, for his information.

S is a priority patient for transfer to Recombinant according to national criteria, and now we have national funding, I am keen to transfer him as he has had some major knee and buttock bleeds recently. He will keep some home treatment in his hotel, and some at GRO-B I'd be grateful if we could transfer further Recombinant Factor VIII there, should he be unable to collect it from here.
