

Further to Dr Greer's letter of 2 November 1983 this moderately severe haemophiliac is generally well and has had only occasionally to use his home treatment with factor VIII concentrate.

Blood count and liver function tests were normal apart from slightly elevated serum alanine maminotransferase which is commonly found in our treated haemophiliacs and is of uncertain significance. As you may have heard it has recently been appreciated that there is an increased risk of AIDS in patient's ecciving regular treatment with clotting factor concentrates and I discussed precautions to avoid transmission of the virus which we are now giving to all our patients who receive regular treatment. I discussed this with both GRO-B and his mother and these precautions are as detailed in the enclosed letter.

GRO-B will be reviewed regularly at the Haemophilia Clinic and if you have any queries please let me know.
