WRITTEN STATEMENT OF BRENDAN BROWN

I, Brendan Brown, Chief Operating Officer of National Health Service Business Services Authority ("NHSBSA"), will say as follows: -

 I provide this statement on behalf of the England Infected Blood Support Scheme ("EIBSS") in response to the request under Rule 9 of the Inquiry Rules 2006 dated 10 July 2023. As with my other statements, this statement is based on information available to the NHSBSA from its records of the EIBSS and the knowledge of members of the EIBSS team. I have made clear where the information is from my own personal knowledge.

Section 1: Introduction

2. My full name is Brendan Craig McMahon-Brown (known as Brendan Brown), and I am the Chief Operating Officer at NHSBSA as from 1 February 2022. Prior to this date, I was the Director of Citizen Services at NHSBSA, and this fact is reflected in my previous statements. My role is based at Stella House, Goldcrest Way, Newburn Riverside, Newcastle Upon Tyne NE15 8NY. Details of my professional background and career are set out in my first statement.

Unfortunately, infected persons continue to pass away, so the variance between these tables will be affected by the those who are deceased.



- NHSBSA have received no instruction from the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) to make interim compensation payments to the estates of infected persons, therefore no payments have been made.

8. The NHSBSA is unable to answer questions on behalf of the Government. The policy detail for the Infected Blood Interim Compensation Payment Scheme is led by the Cabinet Office, supported by the DHSC. Please direct this question to either Government department for the latest position.
