(ii) Number issued = 5,000


(iii) Rate of usage per month = 1,000.

AIDS Leaflet

Further to your letter of the 23rd November, our initial issue from DHSS was 75,000 of which in three months 4,000 have been issued.

These are available at our donor sessions in a similar fashion to other BTS leaflets. Apart from those to relevant members of the ETS staff, copies have also been sent to all Sessional MOs together with a collection of background information in the way of selected reprints. Voluntary Local Donor Organisers too have had copies. We have not mailed direct to donors.

We have had some positive response to the leaflet in that three or four men have written to us saying that they felt they should no longer be blood donors. These may well have been others who have just quietly retired but I think we do have some evidence that the leaflet is having a positive effect. We have had no adverse comment.

We did have a discussion with one of the leaders of the local Campaign for Homosexual Equality. This was a very well-informed intelligent young man who was very complimentary about the leaflet. He did, however, ask what we meant by " ... many different partners" - i.e. what did we mean by "many"? I also gathered that the leaflet produced by the GAY Medical Association, which Diana Walford showed us, is not freely available nationally and a local leaflet has been produced, a draft copy of which I enclose. (It does have one very unfortunate misprint).
