They didn't see why they couldn't take him home since they felt we were not doing anything anymore. They felt this hadn't been communicated with them previously and hadn't had chance to ask questions.</p> <p>I explained that despite stopping fluids we are still monitoring his calcium levels and would like to see them stabilise over a few days before home, as he only received the treatment recently. Also we do not want to give him too much fluid as this can cause problems in itself.
