Tues 4/11/03 17.45hrs HDU

Thurs 13/11/03 p.m. mother advised being discharged on Sun 16/11/03

Fri 14/11/03 12.00hrs staff nurse on ward rang daughter to advise mother bleeding from stomach and should get to hospital asap. After several hours and several phone calls by consultant to Endoscopy Dept mother finally taken unconscious from ward to Endoscopy where advised 5% expectancy of survival. Finally managed to inflate balloon in stomach to stop bleeding and sent to ITU p.m.

Sat 15/11/03 ITU gave 30% expectancy of survival. Still unconscious, tracheotomy and on breathing machine.

Tues 25/11/03 moved to HDU, awake and aggressive.

Fri 28/11/03 Tracheotomy tube removed and sitting in chair, still being drip fed with abdomen extremely swollen and no fluids allowed just water swab for dry mouth.

HDU nurse advised daughter of sore, red rash on mother's inner thighs and asked if daughter could bring in some cream for this condition! Daughter put rolled up tower between mother's legs to keep skin from touching. Brought cream in next day but advised they didn't need as the staff had some and was treating inflamed area.

Sat 29/11/03 19.00hrs advised mother had Hepatitis C virus, no hope.

Mon 1/12/03 06.00hrs daughter taken away from mother's bedside to visitors waiting room by hospital member of staff for discussion. Returned just as mother's monitor dropped from normal reading to 0, member of staff advised mother had passed away, time of death recorded by hospital at 07.20hrs.
