INFECTED BLOOD INQUIRY

FIRST WRITTEN STATEMENT OF JAYNE WARNER

I, Jayne Warner, Trust Secretary for United Lincolnshire Hospitals NHS Trust, will say as follows :-

Section 1. Searches, including search terms used

1. I have not personally searched for these records, this statement is based on facts which are within my own knowledge and belief or which are true to the best of my knowledge and belief from the sources indicated.
2. Searches to comply with the Rule 9 request dated 15 August 2018 were carried out on behalf of the organisation by Bethan Myers, Clinical Lead for the Haemophilia Centre at United Lincolnshire Hospitals NHS Trust and Alison Dawson Meadows, Clinical Nurse Specialist Haemophilia.
3. The searches were mainly paper based. All retained paper records were searched for any details relating to the terms of reference of the inquiry. For those searches of records held electronically the following search terms were used

infected blood
infection
infection status
infected batch numbers
4. During the search the team also contacted former staff members who had worked at the centre to confirm there were not records held elsewhere which had been missed.

Section 2. The Trust's information repositories (from 1950 to present day) such as local authorities, university archives and the National Archives

1. Information belonging to the Trust is held by the Trust or in Trust patient record archives. There are no information repositories such as local

- authorities, university archives or the national archives for which the Trust had or has any control oversight or responsibilities.
2. The Trust Haemophilia Centre did not open until 1981. Prior to 1981 patients were treated elsewhere. However the search did include records which may have related to treatment of patients who transferred to the centre in 1981 who had previously been treated elsewhere.

Section 3. Repositories and archives searched

3. The searches were of all information held in any form which were relevant to the terms of reference of the inquiry. This was mainly paper records held by the Trust Haemophilia Centre and any remaining patient archives.
4. Outpatient records were searched in all formats.
5. The search included the Apex record system, the PAS (Patient Administration System) and Medway System.
6. The search included patient records held in the off site archive

7. The Trust complied with the instruction from the inquiry that no records should be destroyed.
