LORD JUSTICE SCOTT'S ENQUIRY

1. You will wish to see the attached minute from Dr Rejman.
2. It seems to me that despite the specific nature of the stimulus which has caused the enquiry i.e Iraq, if the enquiry enters into areas of public interest immunity and policy on that then it is possible that the papers referred to in Dr Rejman's minute might in some way be regarded as relevant.
3. Clearly this is a matter which I presume Heads of Division would wish to resolve?
4. Until I am told otherwise I will presume that the reference to papers and files is a general one and not limited to registered files. It would be helpful to have clarification on this point also. In the meantime, through this minute, I suggest that Dr Rejman ensures that any papers that he holds personally relevant to this issue are secured and marked such that they are not read nor destroyed.
